The accounts have been audited by PricewaterhouseCoopers who retire and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-appointment.

Respective responsibilities of the General Committee and auditors

The Hong Kong Companies Ordinance requires the General Committee to prepare accounts which give a true and fair view. In preparing accounts which give a true and fair view it is fundamental that appropriate accounting policies are selected and applied consistently.

An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the General Committee in the preparation of the accounts, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the circumstances of the Society, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance as to whether the accounts are free from material misstatement. In forming our opinion, we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the accounts. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Society as at 31st March 2005 and of its results and cash flows for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1 Legal status and principal activities

The Hong Kong Philharmonic Society Limited (the "Society") is incorporated in Hong Kong under the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance and is limited by guarantee. Its principal activities are the conducting and managing of concerts.

Under the provisions of the Society's Memorandum and Articles of Association, every voting member shall, in the event of the Society being wound up, contribute to the assets of the Society to the extent of HK\$10. At 31st March 2005 the Society had 12 members (2004: 12) members.

2 Principal accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these accounts are set out below:

(a) Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and comply with accounting standards issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA").

(b) Recently issued accounting standards

The HKICPA has issued a number of new and revised Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards and Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("new HKFRSs") which are effective for accounting periods beginning on or after 1st January 2005. The Society has not early adopted these new HKFRSs in the accounts for the year ended 31st March 2005. The Society has already commenced an assessment of the impact of these new HKFRSs but is not yet in a position to state whether these new HKFRSs would have a significant impact on its results of operations and financial position.

(c) Income recognition

Government subvention is recognised, when there is a reasonable assurance that the Society will comply with the conditions attaching with it and that the grant will be received.

Donation income is recognised when the right to receive is established.

Income from fund raising activities, box office income and all other income are recognised on an accruals basis. Fees relating to future years are classified as deferred income in the balance sheet.

Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis, taking into account the principal amounts outstanding and the interest rates applicable.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

2 Principal accounting policies (Continued)

(d) Fixed assets

The Society, as a non-profit making organisation, is exempt from compliance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No. 17 "Property, plant and equipment" issued by the HKICPA.

Expenditure on fixed assets is expensed when incurred.

(e) Employee benefits

(i) Employee leave entitlements

Employee entitlements to annual leave are recognised when they accrue to employees. A provision is made for the estimated liability for annual leave as a result of services rendered by employees up to the balance sheet date.

(ii) Pension obligations

The Society operates a defined contribution scheme in Hong Kong, the assets of which are held in separate trustee-administered funds. The pension plan is funded by payments from employees and by the Society. The Society's contributions to the scheme are expensed as incurred and are reduced by contributions forfeited by those employees who leave the scheme prior to vesting fully in the contributions.

The Society has also established a mandatory provident fund scheme ("MPF scheme") in Hong Kong. The assets of the MPF scheme are held in separate trustee-administered funds. Both the Society and the employees are required to contribute 5% of the employees' relevant income up to a maximum of HK\$1,000 per employee per month. The Society's contributions to the MPF scheme are expensed as incurred.

(f) Operating leases

Leases where substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of assets remain with the leasing company are accounted for as operating leases. Payments made under operating leases net of any incentives received from the leasing company are charged to the income and expenditure account on a straight-line basis over the lease period.

3 Taxation

The Society is exempt from Hong Kong profits tax under Section 88 of the Hong Kong Inland Revenue Ordinance.

4 General Committee members' emoluments

None of the General Committee members received or will receive any fees or other emoluments in respect of their services to the Society during the year (2004: Nil).
